General Discussion

- Future discussion:
 - Binding independence to underlying protocols
 - Should SOAP header have a reference to the managed agent?
- WS-Discovery runs over UDP or HTTP. Broadcasts / multicasts a "hello world" to advertise services
- Discussion
 - All management data in general needs to be in CIM
 - o Do we need a specific binding prior to getting it into to CIM?
 - O What do we do in the interim? WSDM? WS-*?
 - o What about multi-function devices?
 - Goal: single XML schema in Semantic Model which can then be mapped to other protocols (CIM, WSDM, WS-*)

- Should we add metadata to SM to support additional MOF requirements for CIM? RDF mapping?
- o Can we get more support for other PWG members?
- Future management applications will encompass imaging devices and are going to be more business critical
- Management applications are getting smarter—using orchestration layers
- Printer security should be included in re-factoring the SM middle layer
- Can we serialize the SM effort such that the MFP alerts effort and CIM mapping (using RDF) start with a common SM baseline and then map the updated SM back to MFP alerts and CIM mapping?
