## Conference Call Minutes

### March 23, 2009

Meeting was called to order at approximately 11 am EST, March 23, 2008.

### General Discussion

- ❖ A reminder of the PWG IP policy was given and no objections were raised.
- ❖ Minutes from the previous teleconference were accepted (see [ftp://ftp.pwg.org/pub/pwg/wims/minutes/cim\\_090309.pdf](ftp://ftp.pwg.org/pub/pwg/wims/minutes/cim_090309.pdf))
- ❖ **CIM print provider prototyping effort:**
  - Rick indicated that the prototype was code complete
  - Rick will post output log files from the tool. There is no concern about releasing MIB dumps from vendors provided to Rick as test cases.
  - Rick recently added character sets supported. This is tied to the natural language attribute
  - Console text is now supported
  - Status roll up is not supported (vendor specific)
  - Languages supported array is now supported
  - Paper Sizes / Types arrays is also supported
  - The CIM Printer MOF needs to be reworks. Ira requested that a list be compiled so all the defects can be worked at one time.
  - Alerts: creation timestamp reworked
  - Instance id for log records were cleaned up

- Media supply is correctly correlated.
- Associations are also complete. Some clean up was required.
- A license agreement will be included in the release from Dell.
- There was some discussion about translate types to/from different media sizes (e.g., international, US)
- Design / release notes will be included.
- Ira asked about the possibility about completing the Finisher MIB (possibly at a later date). Perhaps later this year.
- ❖ No recent progress has been made on the print service MOFs.
- ❖ A power management survey was sent out. Only two responses were received. Bill will send out a reminder announcement with survey in the subject line.
  - Microsoft has expressed interest. Demand should come from an operating system vendor to help justify the work.
  - Management seems to be driven by use cases and business opportunity. These evolve over time.
